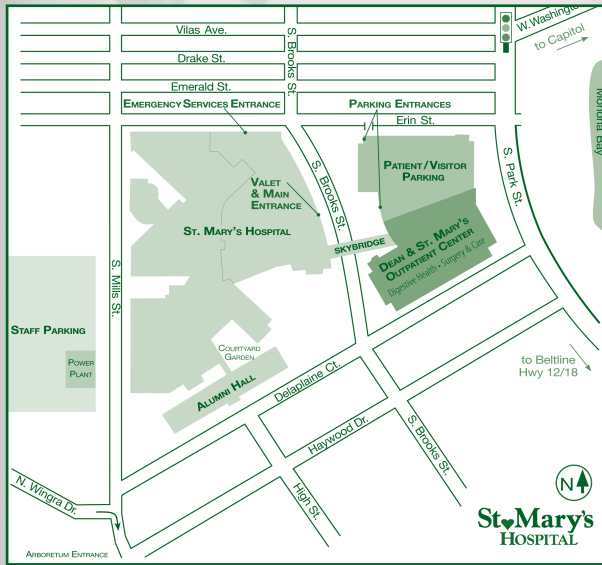


Directions to St. Mary's Hospital
